During World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War, and in the years before and after, thousands of former John Marshall cadets served all over the world... from private to major general; from seaman to vice admiral ... and in all branches of the services, domestic and allied: the Army, the Army Air Corps (later the Air Force), the Coast Guard, the Marine Corps, the Merchant Marine, the Navy and the Royal Air Force and the Royal Canadian Air Force.

They fought in the trenches of France during World War I.

Some were at Pearl Harbor when it was attacked by the Japanese on December 7, 1941. Some were in the invasions of North Africa, Italy, Tarawa, Iwo Jima, Okinawa and they also went ashore on June 6, 1944 at Normandy, France. Some were in the "Bulge", at the battles of the Coral Sea and Midway Island and the crossing of the Rhine into Germany.

At the end of the war in Europe when Germany surrendered on May 8, 1945, they were there. Some were on ships in Tokyo Bay on September 2, 1945, when Japan capitulated.

Former cadets were in Korea from beginning to end: Seoul, Pork Chop Hill, Pusan, Inchon, the Chosin Reservoir and the rest of the well remembered actions.

In turbulent Vietnam, they performed their duty as before, to their everlasting credit

Former Cadets have demonstrated leadership that bespeaks the value of early military training and tradition. All of the highest decorations of our nation, including The Medal of Honor have been awarded to former Cadets.

When the wars were over - they came back....

MOST CAME BACK ...

Seventy-six former John Marshall Cadets did not come back:

**WORLD WAR I: 1
WORLD WAR II: 70
KOREA: 4
VIETNAM: 1**

The Cadets lost were in 28 classes at John Marshall and served in all units of the Corps: the Staff, the Band and Companies A through F; from private to captain.

The Class of 1938 lost 11 Cadets. Company C lost 19.

Two company commanders from Company E and Company F never returned:

Captain JOHN THOMAS INGLES (E'38)
Captain JACK WHITE THRASHER (E'40)
Captain JOHN JENNINGS GIBBS, Jr. (F'42)
Captain JOHN AUBREY CONNELLY, III (F'43)

Two brothers, who had been company commanders, did not come back:

Captain THOMAS LEE THRASHER, Jr. (D'37)
and
Captain JACK WHITE THRASHER (E'40)
